Rights of Pregnant and Parenting¹ Students²

Title IX's prohibition of discrimination on the basis of sex in educational programs and activities includes pregnancy, childbirth, false pregnancy, termination of pregnancy or recovery therefrom (hereinafter "**pregnancy and/or related conditions**"), and parental status. Berkeley College supports pregnant and parenting students and complies with Title IX³.

Title IX Basic Rights:

- As a student experiencing pregnancy and/or related conditions, you shall have **equal access** to both classes and activities.
 - For example, even though you are experiencing pregnancy and/or related conditions, you can still participate in advanced placement and honors classes, special programs, school clubs, sports, honor societies, student leadership opportunities, and other school activities. Berkeley College cannot stop you from joining clubs and activities unless the College has the same rules for all students who have a condition needing medical attention.
 - You cannot be forced to take time off or change your major because you are experiencing pregnancy and/or related conditions, or parenting.
 - As another example, you can decide whether to participate in a program or activity designed for pregnant or parenting students; the decision is up to you and you cannot be pressured to join.
 - If a professor doesn't want you in class because you are experiencing pregnancy and/or related conditions, or parenting, contact the Title IX Coordinator immediately.⁴
- Berkeley College shall not require you to submit a doctor's note **to continue** participating in classes and activities unless the College requires a doctor's note from *all students* who have a physical or emotional condition requiring treatment by a doctor. Berkeley College shall not require a doctor's note from you **upon your return** from a hospitalization in connection with your pregnancy and/or related conditions unless it requires a doctor's note from *all students* who have been hospitalized for other conditions. Documentation from a relevant healthcare provider *is required*, however, in order to receive accommodations (*see the next bullet point*).

¹ "**Parenting students**" in this context refers to **parents of a child under one year of age**. However, rights relating to the expression of breast milk shall continue until the parenting student ceases to express breast milk.

² Students enrolled in education programs within the **School of Health Studies** may be expected to comply with different policies and procedures required at the medical facilities at which they participate in clinical rotations. Such students should direct their questions to the appropriate department Clinical Coordinator, in consultation with the Title IX Coordinator.

- In accordance with supporting medical documentation, Berkeley College shall provide you with **reasonable accommodations** for your pregnancy and/or related conditions, including, but not limited to, a larger desk, elevator access, allowing you to make frequent trips to the restroom, excused absences, extra time on assignments, homebound instruction/at-home tutoring/independent study, and other reasonable accommodations that would be provided to a student with a temporary medical condition. Excused Absences and Medical Leave – Berkeley College Shall:

- Excuse absences due to pregnancy and/or related conditions for as long as your doctor says it is necessary.
- Allow you to return to the same academic and extracurricular status as before your medical leave for pregnancy and/or related conditions began, which should include giving you the opportunity to make up any work missed while you were out.
- Ensure that professors understand the Title IX requirements related to excused absences/medical leave. For example, your professor may not refuse to allow you to submit work after a deadline you missed because of pregnancy and/or related conditions. If your professor's grading is based in part on class participation or attendance and you missed class because of pregnancy and/or related conditions, you should be allowed to make up the participation or attendance credits you didn't have the chance to earn.
