I hereby apply for admission to Berkeley College residence, White Plains campus, upon the terms and conditions of the Agreement set forth below. In consideration of my admission to the residence, I agree to follow all College policies and rules of the residence, which may change from time to time, as they are administered by the Office of Residence Life and the College.

1. A residence deposit of \$400 must accompany this application. The residence deposit will reserve a room for as long as you remain a resident at the White Plains campus and will be applied to any unpaid balance at the end of your final semester in the residence hall, including any damages or fees incurred. Any remaining funds will be returned to you after you have checked out of the residence hall in a satisfactory manner.
2. If the reservation is withdrawn, the entire advance deposit is refunded only if the College is notified in writing at least 10 days before the beginning of the semester to which it applies.
3. The College shall have the right to dismiss you from the residence for failure to comply with policies and rules of the College as administered by the Residence Life Staff. Assignment to a room in the residence hall does not create a tenancy or other property rights. Occupancy is in the sole discretion of Berkeley College and is subject to rules and restrictions set forth in the Residential Life Handbook and other College policies.
4. In the event you withdraw or are dismissed from the residence for any reason, no refund of the Residence Fee or Residence Deposit will be made for that semester.
5. There will be no reduction of room costs if you elect to live away from the residence at any time during the semester, regardless of circumstances.
6. If you are under age 18, this reservation must be signed by your parent or legal guardian, who thereby guarantees the payment of all amounts due.
7. In order to remain in the residence halls during break period, you must submit a break period housing application, pay the break period housing fee of \$250, and receive approval from the Office of Residence Life.
8. Smoking or use of tobacco products is not permitted anywhere at Berkeley College, including residence halls.
9. This Agreement can be modified only by a written instrument signed by you and an authorized representative of Berkeley College that evidences a clear intent to accomplish such modification. This Agreement may not be modified orally and supersedes all previous agreements, representations, and understandings concerning this subject matter. This Agreement is governed in all respects by the laws of the State of New York, without giving effect to its conflict of laws provisions. Any disputes in connection with this Agreement shall be resolved exclusively in a court of competent jurisdiction located in White Plains, New York.
10. Berkeley College is not responsible for loss of or damage to personal property under any circumstances. Occupants are advised to secure valuables and consider obtaining personal property insurance.
