Berkeley Alumni Legacy Scholarship

A scholarship up to 25 percent may be awarded to full-time students in a degree program who have had at least one parent, grandparent, or legal guardian graduate from Berkeley College. Students must maintain full-time, continuous, consecutive term enrollment, and maintain a cumulative Berkeley College GPA of 2.50 or higher at the end of each award year to retain their scholarship.

Achievement Award

Incoming full-time and part-time students enrolled in a degree program with a 2.50 grade point average (GPA) or higher will be considered for an award. Awards are up to \$4,275 per year based on GPA. Students must maintain full-time, continuous, consecutive term enrollment and maintain a cumulative Berkeley College GPA of 2.50 or higher at the end of each award year to retain their scholarship.

Honors Scholarship

2022 high school graduates who are accepted to the Honors Program may receive up to a half- or full-tuition scholarship based on their high school GPA. Students who achieved a high school GPA between 3.00 and 3.49 may be eligible for up to a half-tuition scholarship. Students who achieved a high school GPA of 3.50 or higher may be eligible for up to a full-tuition scholarship. Students must maintain full-time, continuous, consecutive term enrollment, and maintain a cumulative Berkeley College GPA of 3.00 or higher at the end of each award year to retain their scholarship. Students must meet all federal and state grant application deadlines each year and receive a valid (ISIR). (If a student fails to meet the state deadlines and is now not eligible where they would have ordinarily received the award, calculation of the honors award will be less that amount.) DECA/FBLA/HOSA

Incoming full-time students who are enrolled in a degree program and have participated in DECA/FBLA/HOSA in high school may be eligible for up to a full-tuition scholarship. Award amounts vary based on high school GPA. Students must maintain full-time, continuous, consecutive term enrollment and maintain a cumulative Berkeley College GPA of 2.50 or higher at the end of each award year to retain their scholarship. Presidential Scholarship

Berkeley offers 120 half-tuition scholarships and six full-tuition scholarships, which are awarded annually to high school seniors who demonstrate a high level of academic achievement based on their high school grade point average (GPA). Students must maintain a full-time, continuous, consecutive term enrollment, a cumulative 3.00 GPA, and satisfactory academic progress. First-time students enrolled in a degree program must complete all admissions requirements by December 15, 2021 to be considered for this scholarship.

Berkeley College Grant

The amounts for this grant vary based on need and enrollment status. Students are required to maintain satisfactory academic progress.

Berkeley College need-based grant awards are determined after all federal grants, Post-9/11 GI bill amounts, state grants, state scholarships, Berkeley College grants and scholarships (not need-based), outside resources (such as private scholarships, VA benefits other than Post-9/11 GI bill, tuition reimbursement, etc.), and federal subsidized loans have been applied.
